ABOUT THIS REGIONAL FORUM

Opioid abuse has reached epidemic proportions nationally and in Wisconsin. Among pregnant women, opioid use has risen significantly. Early identification of opioid-dependent pregnant women improves maternal and infant outcomes. Providers face challenges, not only in screening, but also in assuring appropriate support for women and their infants.

PURPOSE

The regional forums will focus on strategies for improving health outcomes for women and infants affected by substance use disorders. The forums will build on WAPC's 2015, "Blueprint for Action: Improving Care for Women and Infants Affected by Opioids."
