May 17 12:00-1:00 p.m.	Primary Prevention of Opioid-Exposed Pregnancies <i>Karina Atwell, MD, MPH</i> <i>Tanya Hiser, MS, LPC, NRT</i>	Finding ways to prevent opioid-affected pregnancies is critical to lessening the burdens of opioid use; and understanding the perspectives of women of reproductive age exposed to opioids is key to effective interventions. This webinar will share findings from a survey of women of reproductive age using prescribed opioids. Informed by these findings, the presenters will propose strategies for the primary prevention of opioid-exposed pregnancies through educational and clinical approaches.
August 7 12:00-1:00 p.m.	Recovery Coaching: Support for a Future with Hope <i>Tanya Kraege</i>	Women with opioid and substance use disorders face a number of challenges in many aspects of their lives. Recovery coaches work with women in treatment and/or recovery to support positive change in their lives. Changes can focus on community support and life goals, including relationships, work, and education. This session will 1) highlight the value recovery coaches bring to the care of women during pregnancy and in the postpartum period, and 2) describe strategies for engaging recovery coaches in practice.
November 8 12:00-1:00 p.m.	The Impact of Opioid and Benzodiazepine Use during Pregnancy on Neonatal Outcomes in Wisconsin <i>Charles Vear, MPH</i>	This webinar will describe the demographic profile of women prescribed opioids and/or benzodiazepines during pregnancy and infants diagnosed with neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) in Wisconsin and the patient- and health system-level impact of those medications.
